Royal Exchange Theatre have launched a year-long partnership programme for schools and colleges across Greater Manchester. Each partnership will be bespoke to each school or college, designed with the partner, to ensure maximum impact for students needs. We will draw on our access to exciting, experienced practitioners and artists working professionally in the industry to lead on workshops and projects.

The programme will creatively support the curriculum, promote creativity as essential for wellbeing, and deepen student and teachers' understanding of theatre through workshops, backstage access, performance opportunities and insight into careers from Royal Exchange Theatre's staff and freelance creatives.

This is an exciting opportunity for us to build in depth relationships with students and teachers. As well as providing teachers an opportunities to expand their own practice, we know that from experience, longer engagements help young people to express themselves, open doors that may not have been available before and develop transferable skills that have a significant impact on future aspirations and outcomes.



The partnership programme aims to:

- Promote the 147 jobs & careers young people could have in the arts sector
- Improve young people's wellbeing
- Enhance social skills, confidence and emotional learning
- Develop transferable skills
- Build long lasting relationships with young people and teachers
- Increase cultural capital for young people and schools

Previous Partnership Projects

Examples of projects delivered with previous partner schools include:

Makers Course

This 10 week project gave 30 students an insight into different arts careers. Throughout the project different professional theatre makers visited: Gitika Buttoo gave an insight into directing, Olivia Walters who has worked with SZA, Lorde and Florence & The Machine delivered a stage design workshop. Anna Fernley inspired the students through the world of costume and Steve Vickers, from Manchester International Festival, ran a session about producing. The skills were put into practice culminating in a collaborative group project, using Romeo and Juliet as a stimulus, with each group presenting their ideas.

Great Expectations Curtain Raiser

Across 2 weeks we worked with The East Manchester Academy to create a curtain raiser for Great Expectations, inspired by some of the themes from the production.

The students explored multiple art forms and created a beautiful piece of theatre which was performed to a live audience in The Great Hall before the main house production. The pieces focused on different forms of inequality that the students wanted to highlight such as misogyny, racism, bullying, mental health, women's rights and more. Giving the students autonomy over what was created and a public platform to be heard contributed to the success of the project for both the school and the theatre.

Fashion and Textiles Work Experience

We welcomed in 10 Fashion and Textile Level 3 Diploma students from The Manchester College take part in a 3-day work experience project with our costume department.

The students took part in workshops led by industry professionals such as pattern cutting, embroidery, breaking down fabrics and more. As part of the project, they watched our production 'untitled f*ck m*ss s**gon play' to learn about quick changes, costumes from different eras and they also had a Q&A with the assistant director.

At the end of the project they were set a brief by Head of Wardrobe, Tracy Dunk, to design costumes for our upcoming show Romeo & Juliet which they presented to the wardrobe department and received feedback.

<u>Christmas Panto</u>

As part of a partnership, we supported a school Christmas production of Cinderella by providing a director to bring an outside eye and give support for 3 rehearsals, a lighting technician, a make up artist for the main cast, and access to our costume hire.
